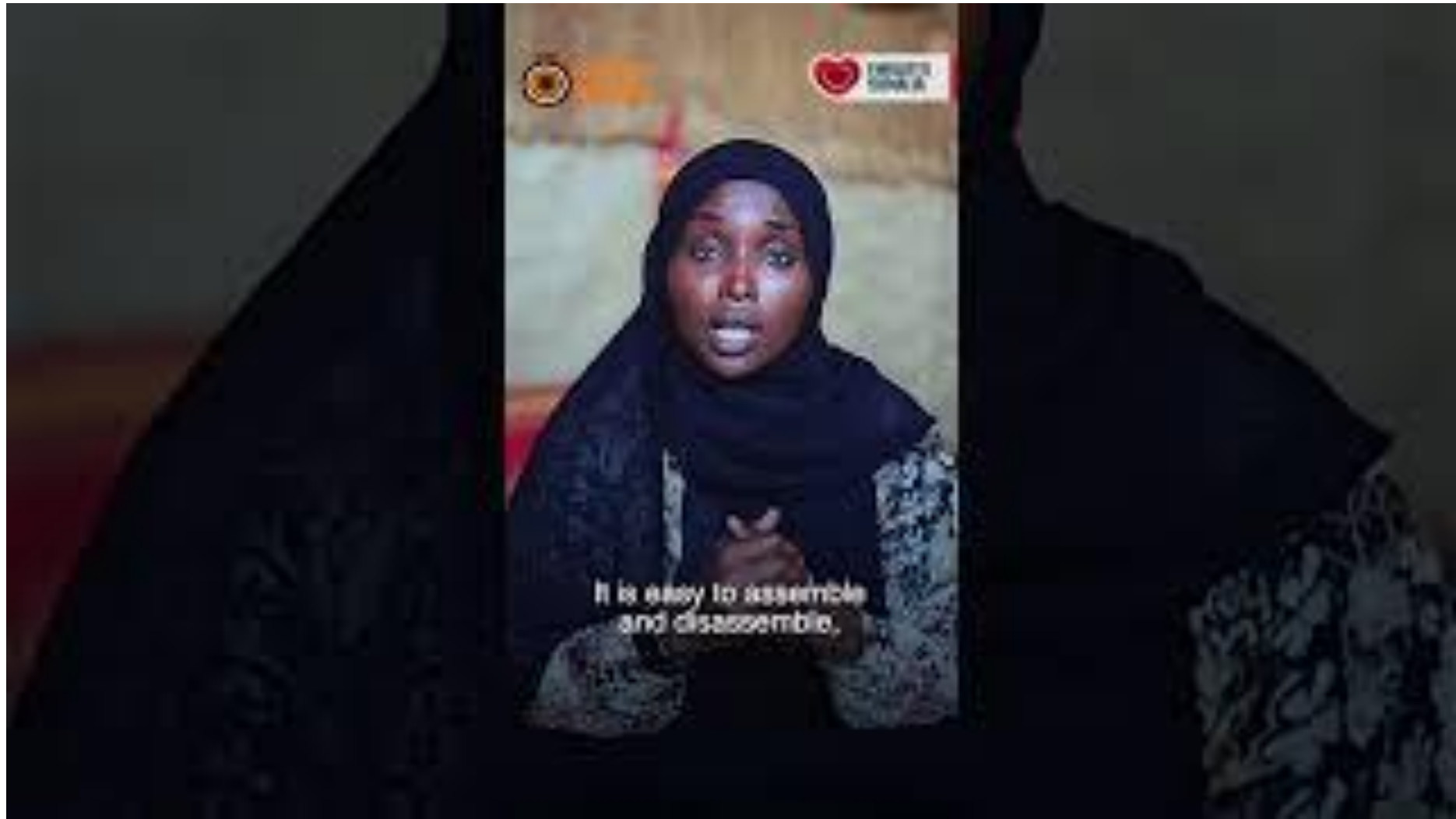

- **Hospitality:** Somalis take pride in being welcoming and accommodating to guests.
- **Time Investment:** Assisting family, friends, and community members.
- **Charity:** Helping those in need is viewed as a moral obligation and a source of dignity.
- **Financial Support:** Sharing money with those in need or supporting community initiatives.
- **Food Sharing:** Offering meals to guests and those less fortunate.

Honor (Sharaf) in Somali Culture

Understanding Honor: a sense of pride and integrity that influences behavior and interactions in various situations.



- **Cultural Significance:**
 - Personal and Family Reputation:** In Somali culture, personal honor is closely linked to the reputation of one's family.
 - Guiding Behavior:** Honor shapes social interactions and decisions, emphasizing respect, loyalty, and responsibility.

Characteristics of Honor (Sharaf)

- **Honesty**
- **Modesty (Xishood)**
- **Personal Demeanor**
- **Treatment of Others**



- **“Gob”**: Individuals with high integrity, respected for their honorable character.
- **“Gun”**: Individuals with low integrity, often viewed negatively within the community.

Expectations of Men in Somali Culture

- **Respectful Interaction**, especially with women.
- **Protection** of family members from danger.
- **Support** of women, as needed
- **Family Care** and commitment
- **Appropriate and respectable dress**
- **Personal Qualities:**
 - Courage
 - Honesty
 - Trustworthiness



Expectations of Women in Somali Culture

- **Social Conduct:**
 - Limit public interaction with men.
 - Avoid loud laughter and eating in public.
- **Dress Code:** Adhere to Islamic female dress standards of modesty.
- **Personal Qualities:** resilience, respect, kinship, generosity, entrepreneurialism



Woman Modesty (“Xishood”)

Women are required to show **modesty** (*xishood*) and not bring shame to their family by immodest or immoral behaviour. The ideal woman is expected to be reserved, polite, and humble.
